A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE PREPARATION AND FILING OF MATERIALS IN CONNECTION WITH APPLICATIONS FOR CONSENTS PURSUANT TO SECTION 133.06(C) OF THE REVISED CODE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 133.06(C) of the Revised Code, a school district may not submit to a vote of the electors the question of the issuance of securities in an amount that will make the school district's net indebtedness after the issuance of the securities exceed an amount equal to 4% of its tax valuation, unless the Superintendent of Public Instruction, acting under policies adopted by the State Board of Education, and the Tax Commissioner, acting under written policies of the Commissioner, each consent to the submission; and

WHEREAS, this Board may submit to its electors at the election to be held on May 2, 2023, the question of the issuance of bonds (the Bonds) in an amount that would make the School District's net indebtedness after the issuance of the Bonds exceed an amount equal to 4% of its tax valuation (but not in excess of 9% of its tax valuation), a precondition to which (without reference to other potentially applicable exceptions) is compliance with Section 133.06(C) of the Revised Code, State Board of Education Policy No. SF-A-04 and State Department of Taxation Tax Equalization Division Bulletin 8, which compliance includes certain action by this Board and the filing of certain documents with the State Department of Education and State Department of Taxation *no later than January 2, 2023*;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of Canton City School District, County of Stark, Ohio, that:

Section 1. Request for 4% Consents. In accordance with Section 133.06(C) of the Revised Code, based on the fact that the Board may determine to place a bond issue on the May 2, 2023 ballot in a principal amount currently expected to be (and not currently expected to be in excess of) \$60,000,000, this Board hereby requests the consents of the State Tax Commissioner and the State Superintendent of Public Instruction to the submission of the question of the issuance of the Bonds to the electors, as the School District's net indebtedness after the issuance of the Bonds would exceed 4% of its tax valuation.

Section 2. Authorization to Provide Materials Relating to Request for 4% Consents. The President and Treasurer of this Board and the Superintendent are each authorized to prepare and sign any applications, forms, statements and other materials and documents that must be filed with the State Tax Commissioner and the State Superintendent of Public Instruction to preserve the School District's ability to obtain their consents for the submission of the question of the issuance of the Bonds to the electors in accordance with Section 133.06(C) of the Revised Code, Ohio Department of Taxation Tax Equalization Division Bulletin 8 and State Board of Education Policy No. SF-A-04.

Section 3. Prior Acts Ratified and Confirmed. Any actions previously taken by School District officials or agents of this Board in furtherance of the matters set forth in this Resolution are hereby approved, ratified and confirmed.

Section 4. Compliance with Open Meeting Requirements. This Board finds and determines that all formal actions of this Board and of any of its committees concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken, and that all deliberations of this Board and of any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were held, in meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.

Section 5. Captions and Headings. The captions and headings in this Resolution are solely for convenience of reference and in no way define, limit or describe the scope or intent of any Sections, subsections, paragraphs, subparagraphs or clauses hereof.

Section 6. Effective Date. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and immediately upon its adoption.
